SOFT PASTEL SET

- It is better to get a small set of professional grade pastels than a large set of inexpensive ones. Get a set of at least 15 sticks.

DO NOT bring to class any pastels that are called *Medium*, *Hard*, or *Pastel Chalk*.

These are not the same as Soft Pastels. If you order online go to the category that is named Professional Pastels. If going to a store ask for good brand of professional soft pastels, not student grade.

The instructor will be using Rembrandt Soft Pastel Set of 45 Assorted Colors.

Rembrandt also offers half stick sets which offer more colors for less money. Using a set of half sticks is fine and less expensive to purchase than full sticks.

PAPER

- Canson Mi-Teintes, 9" x 12", Assorted Colors, 24 Sheet Pad

#B or #2B PENCIL and ERASER

WASHCLOTH

- It's good to have a damp washcloth to clean off the pastel that will get on your hands

LATEX GLOVES (optional)

- If you want to keep your hands completely pastel dust free
